**Digital Hospital Concept**

Presented by: Baldur Johnsen, Healthcare Provider Executive, HP Health & Life Sciences

In this presentation Baldur Johnsen will cover the need to reign in the unsustainable inflation of medical costs. These costs have put pressure on healthcare providers to find ways to address increased demand for health services, waste in the healthcare delivery systems and improvements in care quality. One of the identified measures to reduce costs and address these challenges is to better integrate health systems both horizontally and vertically. The United States has enacted legislation that introduces organisational design, reimbursement mechanisms, and financial incentives to promote care integration and co-ordination. Many countries have undertaken similar initiatives, or are planning to and in this session Baldur will discuss his experience and learnings in this area based on his global role within the healthcare sector.
